Key Stage 2 Candlelit Carols

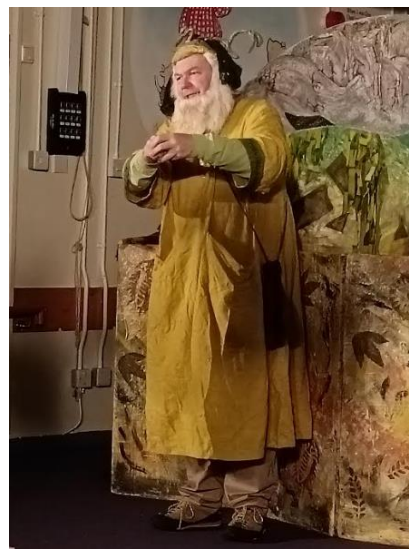

I am delighted to share with you the fantastic news that Mawnan School has achieved outstanding results in the recently published Primary School League Tables for 2023. Our school's performance compared to all schools in Cornwall is truly remarkable, and I am incredibly proud of our dedicated staff and hardworking students.

In terms of progress, we have achieved exceptional rankings in all key areas. Mawnan School is currently ranked 10th for average reading progress score, 18th for average writing progress score, and an impressive 6th for average maths progress score. These results demonstrate the excellent teaching and support provided by our staff, enabling our students to make significant strides in their academic journey.

When it comes to attainment, our school continues to excel. We are joint 13th out of the 269 schools in Cornwall for pupils achieving expected standard in reading, writing and maths, with an impressive 80% of our students reaching this milestone. Additionally, we are proud to announce that we are ranked 13th for pupils achieving greater depth in reading, writing and maths, with 20% of our students meeting this standard.

Mawnan School stands at an impressive joint 3rd place for average reading score and an outstanding 2nd place for average maths score in county. These achievements reflect the high standards we set for our children and the dedication they show towards their education.

The cost is £3 per child per day. Payment is made via your child's ParentPay account. **(Unlike school dinners, this is for payment only and does not book your child's place at Breakfast Club.)**

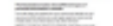
